#### Meteorological Miscellanea

First an update on the number of days without sunshine in the year. At the end of November we were in third place with a month to go. We now have a 30 year record of 87 with 3 days to go. That's almost 3 months! The dullest 3 years are now 1<sup>st</sup> 2024, 2<sup>nd</sup> 2012, 3<sup>rd</sup> 2023. We have to go back to 1999 for the lowest tally of 38. Note the bias towards the latter part of the period.

November 23<sup>rd</sup> saw Storm Bert blast through. The 7<sup>th</sup> December was shaken by Storm Darragh. During the evening of the 6<sup>th</sup> and through the 7<sup>th</sup> rainfall was 1.48 in (38mm). Sleet was sliding down the windows in the cold north wind. It was the wettest day since the 23<sup>rd</sup> of May. The total rainfall for this December looks like being about average at 4.5 in (114mm).

I hope all readers enjoyed a happy Christmas this year. It wasn't "white". It hasn't been white for 14 years now. It seems a long time since we enjoyed three consecutive white Christmases 1998-2000. In the last 30 years we have had lying snow on Christmas Day on just eight occasions. Santa had the mildest Christmas Eve on record – no ice hazard at 47°F (8.3°C). It was the third mildest Christmas in 30 years with 50.5°F (10.3°C). The mildest was 51.5°F (10.8°C) in 2011.

Well, it's not been much of a year most folk seem to agree. There have been a few nice days, let's be fair, and I was lucky enough to 'experience' the Aurora Borealis on  $10^{th}$  October – my highlight of the year. I wish you all the best for 2025.

Appreciation for he and Patsy led to a great turnout too!




