

From our Interim Minister ...



From the window of the manse where my desk is now situated, I watch the leaves change colour, fall, and, blown by the breeze, finally finding a place to rest and return to the soil. The activity has its sense of beauty and melancholy but also of ritual solemnity as the drama offers reflection for the season. For this is the season in which we remember the saints who have died in faith on All Saints Day, and, of course, on Remembrance Sunday we remember those who fell in conflict. We gather up their names as we gather up the leaves of autumn, affirm their uniqueness and recognise what they offered, recall them all and offer them into the arms of God in whom all things are gathered and remembered and no one is forgotten.

All this has special significance this year 2018, on the 100th anniversary of the end of The Great War and the signing of the Armistice on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of the year 1918. Though few remain who were alive then, there are none who were old enough to recall it, though many whose parents did, and those of us whose grandparents lived through it and who were known to us and whose stories are part of our own memories such as my late grandfather's tales of Gallipoli. But there have been many since then whom we remember because they were known to us, such as my father's diary of life as a Japanese POW, and my brother's selected stories of The Gulf, Bosnia and Ireland, and all other words spoken that echo down the years, and those unspoken which have silently rested in a secret place too painful to be swept up.

A few weeks ago, we had a trip to Krakow and took the opportunity to visit Auschwitz concentration camp where over 1 million people were killed in the most dreadful of circumstances with the backdrop of war blanketing out the horrors, the stench, and the screams. Over the door of one of the prison blocks are the words: "Those who do not remember the past are condemned to repeat it" – (attributed to George Santayana).

This is the time we sweep up the leaves, as we sweep up the names of the saints and the fallen, we sweep up the names of those known to us and the millions of unknown soldiers and unknown victims who are known to God. As we do so, and as we pray, and as we remember, may we reflect that when our lives are finally fallen and carried by the breath of the spirit, they might be lives remembered as having been laid down in love for love in the name of the one who showed us the true cost of love remembered.

There will be a service of Remembrance on 11th November 10am and Rainbows, Brownies, Guides, Beavers, Cubs and Scouts are especially invited to attend in uniform.

Ringing the Bells ...

"Her Majesty's Government's ambition is for bells to ring out at 12.30pm on 11th November to commemorate the centenary of the Armistice which signalled the end of the First World War. The Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport wants bells - of any sort and in any location - across the country and worldwide to join in, as is appropriate, to mark this historic occasion". This will be a symbolic way to give thanks for the end of war 100 years ago and will replicate the national outpouring of relief that took place at the end of the war as news of the Armistice filtered through and bells which had long been silent rang out. Bells ringing out at 12.30 will help mark the shift in emphasis from Remembrance in the morning to thanksgiving in the afternoon for the end of war and for peace. This will coincide with the start of the People's Procession, as 10,000 members of the public march past the Cenotaph in a nation's thank you

Following the success of previous gatherings, Alison, Caz and Sarah are putting on another neighbourhood social. This will be held at:


The Turpie Tavern @ Knock Knowes, Blyth Bridge 24th November at 7pm BYOB and BYON (nibbles) Free entry!
