We took the opportunity during Lent to hold some conversations around topics and issues identified as worth exploring within and between our congregations in the linkage. I was personally encouraged by the attendance, contribution and willingness to engage with this journey. Around thirty attended two of the evenings, over twenty on three of them. We looked at Worship, Mission, Communication, Relationships, and Pastoral Care. People shared stories, insights and ideas with others of various perspectives and with some input from myself we were able to focus in on some priorities. People offered their names to be part of small teams to take things forward and that was also very encouraging.

All of this concluded on the Thursday of Holy Week when we over forty gathered for communion in Newlands Church where together we shared bread and wine, the story of Jesus' reconciling love, and we also shared more fellowship over conversations and tea.

This journey together echoed something of the journey a few friends of Jesus had on that Emmaus Road after Easter (Luke 24). They were saddened by what they had experienced, heard stories they could not quite believe, shared their own experiences as they tried to come to terms with the past and all they had heard, as they wandered on not quite sure what lay ahead for them as they headed home hoping for some kind of normality to return to their living.



It was in the sharing of their stories a stranger drew close. In trying to understand the circumstances that words of comfort and hope were offered to them. It was in their openness to inviting the stranger in that their hospitality offered a space to learn. As they ate and broke bread together that it dawned on them and they finally realised Jesus remained with them in a new and different way. They were then able to say, "It was like a fire burning inside!" Something moved and stirred within them in the sharing and journeying together. Then it is as though Jesus left them to get on with living the story. In continuing to trust that Jesus was present in the conversations, in the walking together, in the eating together and being hospitable to welcome a stranger into their company then Jesus comes alive for them.

It was not an easy journey for them, and it is not always easy for us as we walk a new road together. But Easter reminds us that it is in the midst of the emptiness, confusion, uncertainty, and when everything seemed over that a new direction emerges with its accompanying hope, life, and enlivening offering the creation of a new community of faith.

We are Easter people who walk in faith, travel together in hope, and live in love.



THE OPEN GATE PROJECT

A new community resource will be starting up shortly. Look out for future posters around the area, giving the starting date, and contact details.

The Open Gate is being funded by the Go For It Fund of the Church of Scotland, and will be a counselling service available for all ages, and free of charge, offering Solution-based Brief Therapy. This is a pleasant and quick way of helping various problems such as anxiety, depression, low self-esteem, unhappy family relationships, school behavioural difficulties etc. Unlike traditional forms of therapy, this approach focuses from the outset on helping to discover the client's own strengths and solutions, and most problems have usually resolved within 1-4 sessions.

You will find The Open Gate in **Newlands Centre on Friday afternoons between 2 and 5pm**, and appointments can be made by phoning or texting the dedicated phone line. This number will be advertised soon.
