Transitional Support Group Meeting 6th February, 7.30pm, Newlands Church

There will be a meeting on Thursday, 6th February, where all three congregations will gather with the visiting Transitional Support Group to reflect on the past 18 months and to decide whether we are ready to draw this period of Interim Ministry to a conclusion.

STATED ANNUAL MEETING

This will take place after the morning service on March 22nd, 2020. All are welcome to attend.



Representation from our three congregations are invited to gather on 6th February at Newlands Church to share in a time of conversation and reflection on our time together over the past 18 months. We will focus on three main areas. What we have learned? What has been achieved? and, What do we take forward together? Revisiting the initial objectives of this period of Interim Ministry might be helpful as we do so. They were ... to offer a period of settled ministry; allow healing to begin; enable relationships to be rebuilt; strengthen the linkage; enable a better understanding of process; help acknowledge the hurt and frustration caused by the disciplinary process; and provide tools for better ways of working together.

It is in these areas I have sought to offer my presence, my time, and my energy, but it is you rather than I who are best able to identify what might be considered successes and failings. I have my own thoughts but only you can discern the true effect of this period. For although I am the Interim Minister, the interim ministry has been provided, lived, and shaped by us all along this journey together. Has anything changed or been transformed by us during this period? It was never and could never have been a set time where all things broken might be fixed, or varied perspectives become a uniformity of mind, or everyone arriving at the same place at the same time. It was and remains a journey, and as People of The Way (which is what the early followers of Jesus were named) we continue travelling with one another and with Jesus as our companion into whatever future lies ahead.

That future is not perhaps what was expected when we began, but then only reflects life's precarious and unpredictable nature, while rooting our faith in themes of hope, reconciliation, and trust. As we journey, we live in hope, not that things will simply get better with the passage of time but to trust in that deeper grounding which is beyond and within our structures and our expectations. While we are called to live as people who believe in love as reconciliation where we seek a life as reconciling people which is a lifelong task of learning, growing, and loving.

If we have learned anything as individuals, as congregations, or as a wider community of faith, then it must include some aspect of intentionally seeking a better way of doing and being church as a movement of listening, respecting, and walking together along that way.

The church has always been and ever will be a multi-faceted community rather than a homogeneous group, a colourful tapestry rather than a grey cloth, reflecting the God who is larger than we can ever imagine and a Jesus whose living, dying, and rising take us through and beyond the limiting perspectives of the world.

A success might be that we have discovered or rediscovered a way to journey together rather than a destination at which we have arrived, and as People of The Way, perhaps that is our greatest and most honest measure. As the theologian Stanley Haurwas said, "Jesus called us not so much to be effective but to be faithful".

Lamancha, Newlands and Kirkurd Community Council



The next meeting of the Community Council is at 7.30pm on Wednesday 19 February at the Lamancha Hub. We would love to see you at the next meeting or you can contact us at lnkccchair@gmail.com.

The Community Council meets nine times a year with no meetings in July, August and December. Our meetings are always on the third Wednesday on the month and rotate around the three halls in our area; the Newlands Centre, Lamancha Hub and Netherurd Hall. We hear from local people, comment on planning applications, provide the plants for the 22 roadside planters and are able to award small grants to local groups. We also normally have one of our local councillors in attendance. Community Councils need the input of local people or quite simply, we don't exist. Why not come along to our next meeting, see what we do and consider getting involved. We would love to meet you.

Road repairs: At the January meeting concerns were expressed about the poor state of the roads in the area. The Community Council has contacted our councillors to request an urgent survey of the A701 and its feeder roads to West Linton and Peebles from Romanno Bridge and from Blyth Bridge. If you would like to report a road repair you can do this via the website https://www.fixmystreet.com/ The website will notify Scottish Borders Council and the process of reporting issues is quite simple.

Counter Terrorism Training: An award-winning counter terrorism training course is now available to the public for the first time and Police Scotland is encouraging members of the public to sign up. The ACT course is free of charge and comprises seven modules that take a few minutes to complete. You can pause and rejoin at any time and in total the course takes about 45 minutes. "Newlands Community Development Trust (NCDT)

Following our fundraising appeal in this magazine last Autumn we are delighted to advise that with the generosity of some of our community and with match funding from The British Heart Foundation we have now acquired and are installing 3 defibrillators in our ward. They are all automated defibrillators, so training is not specifically required to be able to use them.

- 1 Located at the Newlands Centre in Romanno Bridge just outside the front door
- 2 Located in the old phone kiosk in Blyth Bridge, just beside the bus shelter.
- 3 Located on the wall of Coppice Corner at the Kirkurd/Kirkdean junction.

We will be scheduling a series of training sessions at the Newlands Centre so that anyone can learn how to do CPR as well as use the defibrillators. These will be advertised in due course. Keep an eye out for those. We would like to thank everyone for their donations towards this worthwhile cause.

NCDT endeavours to provide a range of services and facilities that our community needs/wants. We are all volunteers giving up a bit of time to try and achieve this. We would always welcome anyone interested in joining our Board who can bring a particular skill or even just their enthusiasm to our group so that we can continue to run the Newlands Centre and other community services. Many thanks to Nancy Dow for the lovely cakes and cups of tea afterwards.


