The Fleas of Ravensbruck

The Apostle Paul was a person who throughout his life and ministry suffered many personal hardships, professional setbacks, physical sickness, and violent persecutions. But he tells us that throughout all these experiences he learned that God can, if we let him, use all things, even the painful, the unpleasant and the unexpected, to bring blessings out of burdens.

In her book The Hiding Place, Corrie Ten Boom tells of her family's experience of helping Jewish families to escape from Nazi persecution. Sadly, one of their neighbours informed on the Ten Boom family. The Gestapo later arrested Corrie and her family. Corrie and her sister Betsie were sent to Ravensbruck concentration camp. The barrack block that the sisters were placed in was not only overcrowded but also, flea infested. The overcrowding was difficult but for Corrie and her fellow female prisoners the fleas made life intolerable.

Corrie and Betsie had been able to miraculously smuggle a Bible into the camp. In the Bible, they had read the words "give thanks in all circumstances" [I Thessalonians 5:18]. Betsie decided that this meant thanking God even for the fleas believing that God can use all things for our good. This kind of response was initially too much for Corrie, who said she could not do such a thing. But Betsie insisted, eventually Corrie conceded and prayed to God, thanking Him even for the fleas! Over the next six months a wonderful and curious, thing happened. Corrie and Betsie found that the guards never entered their barracks. This meant that Corrie, Betsie, and the women in their block were spared the humiliating experience of being assaulted by the guards. It also meant that they were able to do the unthinkable, which was to hold Bible studies and prayer meetings in the heart of Ravensbruck concentration camp. Through this small Bible study, countless numbers of women came to faith in Christ. It was only at the end of the war that Corrie discovered why the guards would not enter their barracks: It was because of the fleas!

Friends, not everything that happens to us is God's will for us, but God can, if we let Him, make all things work together for our good. The year ahead of us holds its own blessings and burdens. Continuing economic uncertainties mean that people will face difficult financial challenges. There will also undoubtedly be physical, emotional, and spiritual challenges this year. For some of us the act of "giving thanks in all [those] circumstances" might be a step too far. But I want to encourage you that when you face those challenges and "giving thanks" is the last thing you want to do, take a moment, and remember the fleas of Ravensbruck.

A public meeting was held on 24th. November to discuss the future of the Hall.

Lorna McCullough, Area Manager of the Bridge had been asked, as an independent voice, to chair the meeting.

Martyn Blissitt, chairman of the hall committee, thanked Peggy Wills for all her years of dedication to the hall and to the groups which had used it.

Martyn presented a very full report of the background of the hall, the usage and recent finance.

He stated the committee shared many great memories and much affection for the hall and their decision that the hall is no longer fit for purpose has not been reached lightly.

The purpose of the meeting was to seek support for the committee's unanimous decision to discontinue the use of the hall for which it was originally intended. After some discussion and questions from the floor, MB asked eligible voters to identify themselves by a show of hands.

MB asked if any voters disagreed with the Committee's position and stated aims. 0 votes

MB asked if any voters agreed with the Committee's position and stated aims. 24 votes

The committee will now employ a qualified representative to obtain the Title Deeds and clarify options to move forward.

A public meeting will be held in 2022 once information has been collated.

The Hall AGM will be held in May 2022.

The meeting was brought to a close and all thanked for their attendance.

SWEETCORN CHOWDER

1 onion chopped 1 oz. Butter ½ pint milk

11oz.can sweetcorn 1 "Flour 3oz.Philly cheese

1 ham cube (approx.) 4 " Bacon chopped and cooked until crispy

Method:

Sweat onion in butter until soft. Add flour, milk, and approx. 3/4 pint water.

Add stock cube and sweetcorn (drained), and allow to cook for approx. 25 mins.

Add Philly and stir until melted.

Serve topped with crispy bacon.

(a whole stock cube may be too much, adjust to taste)

Garden Ramblings

At the time of writing January is nearly over and I for one am pleased as we have not had much sun this month but today is better and the first snowdrops are in bloom. Seeds are jumping out of the packets but it's a wee bit early for them as some tell you to sow in March. This year I have yellow cosmos to try. A friend gave me some plants last year and they bloomed for months. If you are gardening on a shoestring what better way to get plants? Even Clematis is easy to grow from seed, especially Tangutica (Old man's beard). The seed heads are fluffy and easily pulled apart. This is a good starter clematis as it is so hardy and has nodding yellow bell shaped flowers in bloom over a long period with the seed heads taking you into Autumn.

Joining a garden group is another good way for meeting like minded people to do a bit of swapping plus getting together to visit other gardens and have some cakes too!

I have been a member of the UK based Cottage Garden Society for many years. Look them up online. Our local Hortie group in West Linton is also a very friendly society and worth checking out.
