Pastoral Letter

Build to last.

Dear Friends

Soon after I became minister at Stobo, I was handed a copy of the updated guide book for the church. It contains at the end, a list of all the priests, vicars, and ministers since the erection of the building, and it is particularly humbling to find one's name at the foot of an unbroken list which begins in 1187. It gave a quite compelling sense of being part of the communion of saints of all time, and I often looked out at the congregation and had a sense of the same figures and faces, but wearing medieval, or Jacobean or Victorian clothing as they worshipped.

This year Newlands is celebrating 700 years of a church in that place and several exciting events have been planned. The nearby ruin of the previous building looks slightly sad at present, with only ash saplings gathered round to listen where the pulpit would have stood. But it is a reminder that however attached we may be to our church buildings, some of which are very fine, and while they are one visible sign of the presence of God in a community, they are merely the surroundings which shelter us when we gather together for worship. How much more precious are the living breathing stones which make up the community which is the real Church, body of Christ in that parish or setting. In the same way, I never see disused or converted churches as distressing, because they are merely the discarded shell of a living organism which has moved on. What really matters are the beauty, the strength, the inspiration, the strong sense of community and the ability to function well which we are able to build into the congregation which is the living Church of today.


