Wanderings – gathering to connect life and faith; wondering and wandering together.

- **Gather** connecting people from across the area, coming from different places.
- **Connect life and faith** facilitating a connection between our everyday physical lives and that which is bigger than ourselves through nature and spirituality.
- **Wonder –** we will take time to wonder at the seen and unseen world around us, including space for silence and reflection.
- **Wander –** we will be led on a planned walk through the woods.

 This will be neither fast nor in a straight line, though might be rough and muddy underfoot.
- **Together –** we will ask questions, discuss and journey together with no-one left behind. There will often be time for a cup of tea and extra chat at the end.

Wanderings is a new project being run in partnership with the Church of Scotland parish of Upper Tweeddale. We have an initial plan to meet twice a month, once on a Saturday afternoon and once on Thursday or Wednesday mornings followed by an option to join in a community cuppa. If you would like to join a Wander just turn up at Broughtonknowe woods main carpark with warm, waterproof clothing and stout boots with good grip, some of the routes are a little steep, rough and muddy. We will be back to the car park within an hour and a half. There are composting toilets on site, if you have any additional needs, questions or need a lift (car sharing encouraged) get in touch. Anyone under 18 needs a responsible adult with them.


